WORD ON THE STREET

March is Women's History Month so let us help Women PATCH up a few problems



In the 1970's tobacco companies targeted women for nicotine addiction using Virginia Slims cigarettes ads that played upon the progress and success of women. The cigarette commercial campaign slogan was "You've come a long way baby". Historically women's rights fell behind that of any other population group in the United States, including the right to vote. Women were not allowed to vote in the United States until Congress ratified the 19th Amendment in 1920 that guarantees American women the right to vote. The American Tobacco Company exploited the women's rights movement of the 1920's to increase

their cigarette sales to female customers and did so with the "Torches of Freedom" campaign promoting a women's right to smoke openly in public. A resurgence of the "Torches of Freedom" campaign in the 70's increased tobacco sales to women from 5% in 1929 to about 35% in 1979. With better education and winning lawsuits against the tobacco companies women's use of tobacco in the U.S. has dropped to around 18% but is still higher than the adult average of 16%. What is even more frightening is the percentage of women in the U.S. who smoke while pregnant. 20% of pregnant teens, ages 15 to 17 in the U.S. use tobacco. The connection is most pregnant women smoking did not finish high school. Women, especially pregnant women, should know that nicotine is a drug and like any drug, you should avoid letting it come in contact with you or your unborn child without a medical reason. Smoking or second-hand smoke is a danger to you and your baby. Electronic cigarettes that contain nicotine are still a health threat. The fact is, cigarette smokers are incidental "drug addicts" because of the powerful addicting qualities of nicotine. Nicotine can raise your blood pressure and add to your chances of experiencing heart disease and stroke. Prolonged nicotine consumption can lead to high blood pressure which can enlarge the heart and lead to congestive heart failure. Not to say all the other chances of getting sick from additives in tobacco. If you want a healthier baby, don't smoke while you're pregnant. If you want to be around while your child grows up and be around for their children, stop using tobacco for life. Washington County has a history of being in the top five counties in the State of Maryland for pregnant women using tobacco and this history can change. Brothers Who Care is working with the Pregnancy And Tobacco Cessation Help program to HELP in ways that matter. If you are an older teen or adult female without a high school diploma, we can HELP. Hagerstown Public Access Corporation (HPAC) to help public get use of cable access channel. Back in 2005 a group of citizens formed a federally recognized non-profit organization to help the public get use of a cable access channel per the Cable Franchise Agreement between the City of Hagerstown and Antietam Cable (the Hagerstown based cable company which is owned by Schurz Communications, who also owns the Herald Mail Newspaper in Hagerstown). The City's cable franchise allows Antietam Cable to use public utility poles to bring cable and internet services to the homes of their customers. In exchange for this opportunity cable companies share FREE cable access channels to the public, the education system and the government (typically called PEG access channels).

There is no Public Access Channel, while the City Government and the school systems (Hagerstown Community College and Washington County Public Schools) have had FREE use of the cable system for about twelve years. The cable company has set up its own channel, Washington County Living (WCL-TV30), while their sister company Herald Mail Media has the channel, Herald Mail Television (HMTV6). A Public Access Channel will be ideal for groups that are paying Antietam Cable to air their sporting events or other community programs. With 24 hours in a day and 365 days a year, the public has the opportunity to use that much FREE access time from a company profiting from use of public property. Antietam Cable Company has 90 days to release a cable access channel for public use once the City of Hagerstown has put forth the request. The spoken word style shared by Archie and Lyrical has developed from a partnership that dates back to their college days. The two have an amazing tag team delivery that is sometimes impromptu driven by their ability to take the "pulse" of their audiences whether they are speaking to a group of inner city youngsters at a community center or a crowd of adults in a local club.
